Legacy of Success: Organizational History and Accomplishments

Humble Beginnings and Rapid Expansion

NEW College Preparatory Academy (NCPA) had its beginnings with a dream and a vision of Dr. Kuni Beasley to make a difference in the education and in the lives of young people to prepare them for leadership in the future. That dream and vision has been expanded with phenomenal growth:

Started with Seven Students: The vision came to life in June 1996 with seven students in a rented Sunday School room at the First Baptist Church in Duncanville, Texas, a suburb of Dallas. By the end of that school year, the school had grown to over 30 students in grades 7-12.

Expansion to Nine Schools: In 1997, two more schools were added in the Dallas-Ft. Worth area, grades K-6 were added, and in 1998, there were nine schools and over 700 students.

Expansion to Afterschool, Evening, and Weekend Programs: In 1999, Adult Diploma, College Prep, Speed Reading, and Study Skills programs are offered to the general public afterschool, evenings, and weekends.

Expansion to Homeschool/Distance Education via Internet: In 2002, the school converted to the internet, with all courses delivered via personal computer and designed for online education. This enabled the school to provide distance education and opened the homeschool and distance education markets. By 2003, all the "brick and mortar" schools were phased out, the school was totally internet, and pursuing the homeschool/distance education market.

Expansion with Satellite Schools: In 2004, the "satellite school" concept was developed to deliver the program to a group of students at a single location. Piloted in a home school (aka a "house school"), in 2005 the first satellite school was established at a public location in Sugarland, Texas, a suburb of Houston and several quickly followed.

Expansion into Private Schools: In 2006, several existing private schools researched the satellite model to reduce overhead while enhancing the quality of education and three private schools outsourced their academics to NCPA.

Expansion into Public Schools: In 2008, the University of Arkansas School of Math, Science, and the Arts in Hot Springs has contracted NCPA to provide ACT/SAT preparation courses via the internet to public schools in Arkansas and sub-contracted these services to public schools in Missouri, Ohio, Kentucky, Pennsylvania, Texas, and Colorado.

Expansion with Student with Special Needs: In 2009, the Program adopted for use with students with Asperger's, Autism, Tourette's, and other special needs.

Expansion into the College Planning Market: In 2010, the College Bound Student components of the NCPA program were reconfigured to market them to the general population. NCPA has teamed with college financial planners, college counselors, and formed its own affiliate network to market its products and services.

Expansion into Full-Scale College Preparation: In 2011, NCPA entered into multiple joint ventures to install the College Readiness Business in Houston, San Antonio, Dallas, Los Angeles, and Phoenix to serve the College Bound Population.

- **S**STUDENT SUCCESS STRATEGIES Our program is unique in providing a specific process to develop successful attitudes, behaviors, and habits in young men and women. We train students to use SMART Strategies using SMART Goals: Specific-Measurable-Actionable-Realistic-Time Sensitive.
- **S** <u>SUCCESS TEAMS</u> We form Success Teams around each student starting with the parents, and adding a Mentor, coaches, advisors, and counselors as needed. The Success Team's mission is to provide the guidance and resources to equip the student for success.



<u>PSAT-ACT-SAT-Skills (PASS)</u> – We have complete programs for Basic, Advanced, and Personalized Training in Test-Taking-Techniques that have proven to increase scores. Learning Strategies & Skills

A comprehensive integrated program to train students to Read-Study-Test-Write *better*, *faster*, *easier*, and *independently*. Known by its initials - <u>RSTW</u> - this program has been the foundation for success since 1996.

READ – This is the latest version of the famous *Mega Reading* program, which was seen on TV and sold a million copies. Howard Berg, "the World's Fastest Reader," updates his program for the 21st Century and customizes it for our audience. Dr. Kuni Beasley enriches this program with higher level reading strategies that equip students to read faster, comprehend more, and organize their information better.

STUDY – Using the ROAD Method - Read-Organize-Analyze-Document – students use Advanced Reading Strategies and innovative Note-Taking-Techniques to Gather, Process, and Apply information. Students are introduced the use of Tables in MS Word to Organize and Analyze information, and Tables are used to format notes in study sheets for tests or as templates for writing assignments. 

Academic Strategies

Curriculum Strategy – Our curriculum is designed to be flexible and easy to use, yet prepares the student for College Success: <u>Accessible via PC/Internet</u> – Our students can learn anywhere. We have students all over the world in places like Cambodia, New Zealand, and Uganda. <u>Embedded Learning Strategies</u> – The Curriculum is designed to train students to apply and master the RSTW strategies in their REAL course work. <u>Individualized to the Student</u> – The Curriculum and Individual Courses can be Customized and tailored to individual needs. <u>Optimized</u> – No busy work. Once the student has demonstrated competence, the student moves on. Anything that does not prepare a student for College Success has been removed. <u>Unencumbered by Obsolete Methods</u> – The program is Student Centered. The Monolithic "teacher in front of the class" has been obsolete for years. It has been proven that students can learn better and faster on their own.

Homeschool Strategy – For those who homeschool, we provide "Homeschool Without the Hassle." Hassle-Free – We do all the administrative work. Each student is assigned a personal Mentor who handles grading, curriculum, records, and training the student how to make an "A." Online Delivery – Everything is on the computer. No books, no lugging book bags, and you can take school anywhere you go. Mom in Control – Mom has the time to be Mom instead of trying to juggle all the academic and administrative tasks. Easy to Implement – As a Parent, you just have to make sure your student sets goals, does the work each day, and submits work for review each week. We do everything else.

Acceleration Strategy – for Advanced, Ambitions Students. <u>Schedule in Blocks</u> – Just like college, we schedule students to do fewer courses in a shorter time. Students work on three courses at a time and are able move faster because the focus is more concentrated. <u>Twelve-Month Program</u> – In a conventional school, students get "Spring Fever" about the middle of April and coast until summer. After the summer, it takes until Columbus Day to get back to mid April, losing 6 months. Our students stay on track 12 months and can get two academic years done in one calendar year. <u>Early Graduation/College Ascension</u> – Students who wish to move quickly can graduate early and/or take college course when they demonstrate the skills and maturity to take them on. <u>Programmed Instruction</u> – Allows students to answer questions about a unit of study at their own rate, check their answers, and advance after answering correctly. <u>Student Pacing</u> – Students move at their own pace, not the pace of the "class" or "teacher." Most students can move faster than a conventional classroom, and those who may need more time to master the material are given more time.

Mastery Strategies – Students learn it is easier to make an "A" than a lesser grade. "Mastery" Standard – We have only two grades: "A" or Incomplete. Students rework their lessons until they get an "A." Mentors train the student how to make "A's." Mistakes are corrected before the student proceeds. Students are Monitored weekly to insure standards are maintained. Much more is accomplished in less time when our tools are used.

Performance Strategies – We train students to perform at the College Level to be Independent, Self-Sufficient Learners. We use a <u>Socratic Method</u> where students <u>Learn Through Questions</u>, we promote the <u>Heuristic Process</u>, where students learn through a <u>Process of Discovery</u>, and we apply <u>Androgynous Learning Strategies</u> to build on <u>what is already known</u>. We add a <u>Personal Performance Model</u> that trains the student to teach themselves (<u>Erudition</u>), to share knowledge with others, to frame information so others can use it, and to gather information from others (<u>Elucidation</u>), and express one's thoughts and ideas in speech and writing (<u>Elocution</u>). Finally, we <u>Empower</u> students to pursue interests and passions within the framework of preparing for College Success.

Acceleration Strategies & College Opportunities

We provide unique and innovative opportunities to complete high school early, earn college credits, enter college early, combine high school and college courses, and save thousands of dollars minimizing college time and costs. Our strategies have empowered students to graduate from high school 2-3 years early, complete college at 19, and we have helped several students enter law school and medical school at 19.

<u>Accelerated High School Program</u> – By applying the Learning Strategies and Skills to individual assignments and courses, strategically aligning courses in sequence, and working at a consistent pace for year-round (with frequent breaks), students can complete two academic years in one calendar year.

Bachelors Degree Opportunities – We have helped many students and returning adults earn their Bachelors Degree through various non-traditional, online, and distance learning programs, many of which require less time and expense, and are flexible to meet a person's schedule. We have had student graduate college as young as 16!

<u>College Credit by Examination</u> – We show students how to earn college credit through CLEP and DANTES testing. Our program includes access to reference material, practice testing, and a systematic process to learn the material quickly and pass the test for college credit.

<u>Dual Credit and Dual Enrollment</u> – Students can earn both high school and college credit (dual credit) for a wide range of courses, and many students have the opportunity to enroll at a local or distance learning college while still in high school.

<u>2+2+2 Strategy</u> – We have pioneered the process of helping students complete high school and college in six years. Our 2+2+2 strategy moves the ambitious student through two years of high school to develop the foundation of skills and abilities to tackle college level courses early, two years of dual credit college work combining the last two years of high school and the first two years of college, then completing the last two years of college.

Setting and Achieving Life Goals

Our program is unique in providing a specific process to develop success attitudes, behaviors, and habits in students.

SMART Goal System - Developing the foundation of long term success with SMART Goals (Specific-Measureable-Action-Relevant/Realistic-Time Specific), Wish Lists (turning wishes into wants, and wants into what you are willing to work for), and G.O.T. (Goals-Objectives-Targets) process of breaking down goals into daily targets.

SMART *Mind Set* – Developing Strengths, Self-Motivation, Attitude, Resolve, and Tenacity to achieve your goals

SMART Skill Set - Developing Self-Discipline, Maturity, Accountability, Responsibility, Time Management

SMART Assets – Developing the Systems, Methods, Approaches, Resources, and Techniques to be equipped for any challenge.

SMART Materials, Applications, Resources and Tools - We train students to use a weekly planner to translate monthly goals into weekly objectives and daily targets, how to maintain a Gratitude Journal, and constantly integrate action toward SMART Goals every day. Over time, this cultivates their SMART Mind Set, develops their SMART Skill Set, and builds up their SMART Assets.

Success Teams

We form Success Teams around each student starting with the parents, and adding a Mentor, with coaches, advisors, and counselors as needed. - Monitoring The Success Team constantly monitors the student's progress and makes adjustments with the student.



Clarifying Information

PE Credit

For Internet Students, PE credit can be earned by participating in a team sport, taking sports lessons (karate, judo, fencing, archery, and similar), or logging a personal fitness schedule. Students document their activity on their monthly logs and provide verification of participation confirmed by an instructor or coach. One-half credit is awarded for each semester of activity and a maximum of 4 credits can be earned with 3 credits applied to electives. Minimum requirement is a total of 36 hours of participation per term. In special cases, more than 4 credits can be placed on the transcript if the student is involved in more than one activity during a semester. Activities such as Civil Air Patrol, Sea Cadets, National Defense Cadet Corps, Young Marines, Marching Band, Drum Corps, and similar can be awarded PE credit with proper documentation.

Speech

For Internet Students, Speech credit can be earned via our online course, through a local homeschool co-op with a speech class, a local Toastmasters club, or some combination of actual speeches presented and background coursework.

Fine Arts

Fine Arts credit can be earned through taking a Fine Arts/Humanities course in the curriculum, participation in a Fine Arts activity (Dance, Ballet, Painting, Sculpting, Pottery, Photography, and similar); participation in a Choir, Theater, Music Ensemble, or similar; individual lessons (Piano, Voice, or similar); or presenting a Fine Arts portfolio (Scrapbooking, Handicrafts, Leatherwork, and similar). 36 hours of documented activity per term is required.

NOTE: Activities such as Ballet and Dance can be used for PE credit, but cannot be used for both PE and Fine Arts credit

Electives

Many courses and activities can be used for elective credit. The 36 hours of documented activity is required for non-academic electives. In addition, Driver's Education, Red Cross First Aid Courses, Continuing Education courses, and approved personal projects can used.

Advanced Measures Advanced Measures are used to validate a student seeking a Distinguished Diploma. These Measures include: an Advanced Personal Project, 99% score on the SAT or ACT, National Merit Qualification, passing a CLEP exam, completing a college course with a 3.0 or higher, and similar.

In all these, the Mentor needs to verify, validate, and/or approve the activity used for credit before the activity or course is started


